Little Book of Hygee (hoo-ga) by Meik Wiking, CEO of the Happiness Institute in Copenhagen. Danes are said to be the happiest people in the world. Hygee loosely translates as "a sense of comfort, togetherness and well-being" (William Morrow, \$19.99).

Three Days in January by Bret Baier explores the presidency of Dwight D. Eisenhower looking at his last 3 days in office and his farewell address (William Morrow, \$27.00)

The Undoing Project by Michael Lewis is the story of Israeli psychologists, Kahneman and Tversky, who wrote a series of studies which created the world of behavioral economics. This led to a trend of distrusting human intuition and trusting numbers and science (W. W. Norton, \$28.95).

The Orphan's Tale by Pam Jenoff is a powerful novel of friendship and sacrifice, set in a traveling circus during World War II (Harlequin, \$15.99).

The Width of the World by David Baldacci is the third in the Vega Jane series following *The Finisher* and *The Keeper* now available in paperback (Scholastic, \$17.99) ages 8-12

Mighty, Mighty Construction Site by Sherri Duskey and Tom Lichtenfeld is the story of the biggest job that the truck crew has ever had, but together, they can do it (Chronicle Kids, \$16.99).
